

## **SUN ROBOTS**

Those of us who've been caught in the traffic chaos caused by Eskom's recent load-shedding will be glad to hear that the government is offering tax incentives to companies investing in the provision of solar-powered traffic lights. According to the National Energy Efficiency Agency, which is managing the project, the first R40 million was contributed within days, and funds for the first phase were expected to exceed the initial R100 million target.

First off, some 2 000 traffic intersections in the Johannesburg area have been earmarked for the solar-powered "robots". A number of these are on Grayston Drive, the hard-hit artery from the M1 highway to the Sandton CBD.
